NOBODY EVER SAYS:

"THANK YOU FOR BEING LESBIAN OR GAY."

A Dialog by Jack Andrews

"Nobody ever says: 'Thank you for being lesbian or gay.'"
"Why the hell should they?"

"Because lesbians and gay men improve the quality of life for everybody."

"You've got your head screwed on backwards. It's just the other way around. Faggots corrupt life."

"No, they don't. Not as a result of being lesbian or gay, anyway. The bottom line to homosexuality is that it's naturally contraceptive. Lesbians and gay men don't have children unless they're forced or persuaded to go straight. That means homosexuality slows down population growth. Slower pop growth is good for society, everybody in it and the environment, as well."

"Gee, maybe we should declare a national holiday, huh? We could start by remembering all the faggots and dykes who lost their lives in the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah — and why?"

"That'd be okay except for one thing —"

"What's that?"

"Most of the people who died at Sodom and Gomorrah were straights — heterosexuals."

"Says you."

"Says history. The word sodomy comes from the sexual practices of the Sodomites, straight people who preferred anal sex to vaginal intercourse. You've got the right idea in one sense though. A national holiday to honor lesbians and gay men ought to be declared. Everybody should have the day off to reflect on the value of homosexuality to society."

"You're crazy."

"You're bigoted."

"Let's change the subject. Queers don't interest me."

"I'd appreciate it if you'd use lesbian, gay or homosexual instead of faggots, dykes and queers."

"Yeah? Well, people in Hell want knowwater, too. You started a conversation buddy. If you don't like the way I talk, buzz off!"

"Alright, have it your way. Now, we thank mothers and fathers for having children, don't we? That's what Mother's and Father's days are about, isn't it? We should also set aside a day to thank lesbians and gay men for not having children."

"We don't —"

"Let me finish. It's just as important to the well being of society not to have children as it is to have children. Gay men and lesbians are just as deserving of recognition and thanks for their contribution to society as straight parents are."

"You know better than that. We don't thank mothers and fathers for just having children. Their dedication to making the community a better place to live is part of the deal."

"Lesbians and gay men are dedicated to the same proposition and put their time and money on the line to help make it happen — as anybody involved in community affairs knows."

"Look, we have all kinds of ways to slow down population growth. Condoms, birth control pills and devices, vasectomy. We don't need homosexuality to do the job, especially when we consider what comes with it."

"Condoms are not always used though, are they? A million abortions a year in the U.S.A. alone proves that. Birth control pills and devices can cause cancer or destroy a woman's capacity to conceive life. At the very least, they have unpleasant side effects. There aren't enough men willing to have vasectomies to make a difference in pop growth. On the other hand, homosexual behavior is a relatively harmless and absolute guarantee that a certain number of lives will not be added to our population. If left to work its way without harassment or rejection, in time, homosexuality might eliminate the need for straights to worry about birth control at all."

"If lesbians and gays are so good, why do I have this picture in mind of them as perverts whose craving for degenerate sex endangers the health and morals of others, particularly young people? Please don't tell me my imagination is the reason, don't believe it!"

"Wow, it's hard to believe people still think the way you do even though I know many do. Of course, it's your imagination. You were taught to think of lesbian and gay love and sex that way. Homosexual behavior has been used as a scapegoat for the real cause of ill health and moral decline in society — overpopulation — ever since it was outlawed by our ancient ancestors. There is no evidence to show that homosexuality is any more dangerous to health and morality than heterosexuality. If anything, straights take the cake in both respects. The statistic I mentioned on abortion a minute ago aptly illustrates how dangerous and immoral heterosexual behavior can be. And that's just one example."

"So, the Reverend Falwell is wrong. Jimmy Swaggart is a liar. The Holy Bible lies and our ancestors who outlawed homosexuality were lousy at that!"

"I wouldn't say that."

"You just did. What else do you think you're saying?"

"Those who oppose gay/lesbian love and sex are honorable, well meaning people, but naive in their belief that homosexuality is wrong. That's what I'm saying. The same naivete affected the perception of homosexuality our ancestors had. The Bible, after all, was written by people. Human beings are prone to err. Recognizing that fact, our ancestors corrected the Bible from time to time whenever errors in judgment became apparent. That's a reasonable procedure in keeping, I'm sure, with the Will of God. The adjustment of religious thinking to the great good homosexuality does is underway. The only thing holding up a fast change in attitude is the strictly human reluctance of church goers and the religious minded to admit that they've been wrong about homosexuality. Such an admission entails accepting a certain amount of guilt for prejudice

past and present and the tragedy which has grown out of it. It would, of course, be better to face the issue now and deal with the guilt rather than go on compounding one of the great tragedies of the ages. A tragedy that has harmed straights to a far greater degree than it has lesbians or gay men, by the way."

"The Pope says that homosexuality is sick. I guess we've got to humor you people until you get well."

"The Pope is a good, but naive man stuck with the same ideas as his predecessors."

"Everybody is naive except you. The experts are wrong. Homosexuals are right. How self righteous and dumb can you get?"

"The experts, at least scientific ones, have destroyed the claim that homosexuality is unnatural, unhealthy and immoral."

"Nuts! The Masters and Johnson study showed that lesbians and gays choose to be the way they are. I don't call that natural."

"A Kinsey Institute study produced the opposite finding. It suggests that homosexual inclination is inborn. Use your head. Does it make sense to believe that anyone would choose to be lesbian or gay? Would you choose to join a group of people who are subjected to as much social, economic and political prejudice as lesbians and gay men are? Being lesbian or gay — like being straight — is something the individual has no choice in making. Nature preempts the field. We interfere with Her decisions in the matter at our own risk."

"I might choose to be homosexual if I was sick in the head, if my sense of moral values was twisted, if all I could think about was depraved love and sex and really didn't give a damn about others or myself though I gave people the impression that I did."

"The kind of choice Masters and Johnson were talking about is not the sick in the head variety. The sick in the head argument doesn't stand up to reality any better than free choice, however. How could millions upon millions of lesbians and gay men survive in this society or any other if they weren't healthy, reasonably happy, hard working, law abiding persons who care about themselves and others. The nature of survival demands cooperation with society and concern about others, as well as, self fulfillment. You can't have one without the other. Life is a joint venture involving everybody."

"If what you say is true, why did a number of the homosexuals in the Masters and Johnson study choose to go straight and happily succeed in doing so? You'd have thought they would have rejected the idea out of hand. Answer that, mister."

"It's possible to persuade yourself that you can be heterosexual. You can convince yourself that you're happy. Human beings have highly developed imaginations which enable them to distort the truth about others, about themselves. You must also take a couple of other things into consideration. Sexual feelings are more ambiguous, generally speaking, in an overpopulated society and world like ours whether people are aware of it or admit to the ambiguity. In other words, many persons find it easier to move in either direction sexually. Also, keep in mind that homosexuals and heterosexuals are very much alike — not different. Man and woman relationship endures in both instances. The only significant difference between them is same sex versus opposite sex attraction in the search for love and sexual satisfaction. All things considered, it's not surprising that Masters and Johnson mistook persuasion for choice."

"The difference between lesbians, gays and straights may not seem like much to you, but as far as I'm concerned, the difference is what counts?"

"You're absolutely right, it does. The difference is that homosexual mating is non-reproductive — an event no less important than heterosexual mating and the eventual birth of a child."

"That's not what I meant and you know it. Now you're trying to make homosexuality sound as great as parenthood. It ain't."

"It is. It helps increase the potentiality that the children of straight persons will have a chance to live a better life because there will be fewer people to compete with them for jobs, space, housing, air, food, water and the environmental qualities it takes to produce healthy, happy living. What greater blessing could you ask of God or Nature?"

"Or, you're so called blessing could turn into a nightmare. There could be no people left to enjoy the fruits of this earth after gay liberation gets through with it. Isn't it clear to you that if homosexuals are allowed to do as they please indefinitely, the entire human race will be wiped out?"

"It can't work out that way. Nature decides who will be straight, lesbian, bisexual, gay and transsexual in relation to the need for approximate balance between anticipated economic/environmental productivity and population growth. It is also apparent that Nature requires lesbians and gay men to take an interest in and practice sex to prevent the loss of procreative capacity. Thus, in the event of a catastrophe resulting in loss of human life below a level safe enough to guarantee our survival as a species, lesbians and gay men would change from homosexual to heterosexual behavior and help return the strength of our population to normal. Since the practice of sodomy, oral sex and even masturbation stimulate vaginal intercourse, they would be well prepared to assume straight reproductive roles. It also follows that if population diminishes under regular circumstances, the need for homosexual behavior will diminish. Lesbians and gay men would change to straight behavior if the need arose or simply lessen in number generation by generation."

"Nonsense! You don't know what you're talking about!"

"On the contrary, what I'm talking about is quite valid. It's even scientific. Animals who behave homosexually change or revert to heterosexual behavior almost as soon as overpopulation among them is relieved. The threat overpopulation poses to social stability and survival is resolved faster in the wild than it is in civilization because animals obey Nature

Murder Of Arizona Gay Legal?

BISBEE, AZ - An obscure law might be used to defend two teenagers who are accused in connection with the murder of a Gay Cochise County man (Observer, Nov. 21). The youths, aged 13 and 16, are believed to have stabbed Charles Bush to death in his St. David mobile home on October 29. The body of the 34-year-old nurse was discovered the following afternoon near a roadside rest area in Benson. The juveniles were apprehended in Van Horn, Texas when authorities there noticed the teenagers attempting to sell Bush's belongings at a swap meet.

In a recent interview with Benson radio station KAVV, Cochise County Public Defender Wallace Hoggatt cited the possibility of using Arizona Statute 13-411 to justify the homicide. The law permits "deadly physical force" to prevent child molestation. A widely circulated speculation is that Bush, an avowed homosexual, may have made advances to the teenagers after picking them up near Tucson and taking them to his residence.

The teenagers remain in custody in Bisbee pending trial. In the near future, Superior Court Judge Matthew

Borowiec is expected to determine whether the teenagers will be tried as adults.

The exact wording of Arizona Criminal Code Statute 13-411 reads as follows:

"13-411. Justification; use of force
In crime prevention

A. A person is justified in threatening or using both physical force and deadly physical force against another if and to the extent a reasonable person would believe the physical force or deadly physical force is immediately necessary to prevent the other's commission of arson of an occupied structure under #13-17045, burglary in the second or first degree under #13-1507 or 13-1508, kidnapping under #13-1304, manslaughter under #13-1103, second or first degree murder under #13-1104 or 13-1105, sexual assault under #13-1406, child molestation under #13-1410, armed robbery under #13-1904, or aggravated assault under #13-1204, subsection A, paragraphs 1 and 2.

B. There is no duty to retreat before threatening or using deadly physical force justified by subsection A. of this section."

West Hollywood Elects Lesbian Mayor

WEST HOLLYWOOD, CA (CON) - Only 23 days after becoming a city, West Hollywood has taken the unprecedented step of choosing a Lesbian as its mayor. Under a format in which the city council selects a council member to serve as mayor, Valerie Terrigno was elected unanimously by the five-member council.

Her November 29 election as mayor comes only weeks after West Hollywood distinguished itself as the first city council with a Gay majority. Three of the five council members, Steve Shulte, John Heilman and Valerie Terrigno, are openly Gay, which prompted Heilman to say, "We hope everyone will come visit us."

Helen Albert, 75, and Alan Viterbi, 22 round out the council. They ran on the same slate as Terrigno and Heilman and also supported Terrigno for mayor. At the same meeting, the councilors also enacted an anti-discrimination ordinance based on sexual orientation. The ordinance prohibits discrimination in housing and employment and will apply to the city and county contractors. The council also enacted a rent freeze, a moratorium on evictions and a freeze on development, until it has time to enact more specific legislation.

Terrigno, 31, became the favorite as mayor after she received the highest number of votes in the council election on November 6. Sally Fiske, Terrigno's campaign manager, described Terrigno's reaction to being selected mayor as "very excited" and "very moved."

Fisk said that the election of a predominantly Gay city council and the selection of a Lesbian mayor have sparked extensive media interest in the town and councilors, particularly Terrigno. Fisk said Terrigno was being asked to make television appearances, had been contacted by People magazine and by the German magazine Der Spiegel.

For the past four years, Terrigno has been the executive director of the Crossroads Counseling Service, a social service agency dealing with housing, nutrition, employment problems and life crisis problems of its clients, many of whom are homeless.

She campaigned for Walter F. Mondale in the 1984 presidential election and was a delegate to the Democratic National Convention in San Francisco.

John Heilman, 27, is a Gay activist attorney. He is the secretary of the Southern California chapter of the ACLU and is also co-chair of the ACLU Lesbian and Gay Rights Chapter. Heilman has been working with Don Simonoski and the National Lesbian and Gay Archives on the release of FBI

files detailing the Bureau's surveillance of Gay organizations and individuals from 1952 to the present.

Steve Shulte, 38, is a longtime Gay activist and is the former executive director of the Los Angeles Gay and Lesbian Community Center. Of the five councilors, Shulte is the only one who has governmental experience; he is a former aide to Los Angeles City Councilwoman Peggy Stevenson.

ANTI-PORN LAW UNCONSTITUTIONAL
INDIANAPOLIS, IN (GCH) - A local ordinance defining pornography as a form of sex discrimination was declared unconstitutional on November 19 by a federal court judge here, according to the New York Times.

Judge Sara Evans Barker said the anti-porn law violates free speech. Supporters of the bill say they will appeal Barker's ruling to the Seventh Court of Appeals in Chicago. Barker's decision is the first court test of the radical feminist civil rights approach to censorship of pornography.

Barker ruled that the ordinance specifically restricts the sale and distribution of pornography which violates the First Amendment right of free speech.

Richard Kammem, the attorney for the American Booksellers Association, one of the groups challenging the law, said he believes it is unlikely the law can be written to make it constitutional.

Barker also ruled against the city's argument that this form of sex discrimination is of such compelling interest to the state that it warrants exception to the First Amendment.

implicitly. As for the relationship between pop growth and anticipated economic/environmental productivity, as any naturalist can tell you, the scheme of life in the wild is an inter-dependent process of give and take affecting all animal behavior. The survival of species succeeds only by limiting the pop growth of each form of life to what it can be expected to produce, give-up and take in cooperation or confrontation with its own kind, other species and environmental events. Nature uses a variety of ways to control pop growth depending on the situation and character of species. Homosexuality is one of them and probably the most beneficial of all of them. Now I ask you, is it reasonable to assume that Nature would do anything less for humans and their habitat, civilization, than She does for animals and plant life in the wild?

"We're not animals."

"Then, why do we act like animals? Why are the motives for what we do like those of animals? We behave heterosexually like animals, for example. Why?"

"You know damn well, why. We have to reproduce ourselves."

"Yes, it's in our best interest to behave heterosexually like animals, isn't it? We couldn't survive otherwise, could we?"

"Of course not. Stop asking me questions you know the answer to!"

"If it's also in our best interest to behave homosexually like animals, it will slow down our pop growth and help improve everybody's chance at survival and a better life, why shouldn't some of us be lesbian or gay if that's how we're so inclined?"

"Because it's immoral, dummy, that's why."

"For something to be immoral, it's got to hurt. It's got to hurt somebody or society. Where's the proof that homosexuality is immoral?"

"Child molesting, prostitution, rape, being, cheating, stealing, pornographic hustling, drug addiction, venereal disease, alcoholism, sadism, masochism, AIDS. How's that for proof, buddy?"

"Very impressive. But, the things you mention affect society as a whole. They are not caused by or exclusive to homosexual behavior. With the exception of AIDS, the incidence of each of them is either lower among lesbians and gay men or about the same as it is for straights."

"AIDS is bad enough. AIDS is caused by homosexual behavior."

"How can you say that AIDS is caused by homosexual behavior. Nobody knows the cause of AIDS. High ranking scientists on both sides of the Atlantic believe that AIDS is caused by a cancer virus, a leukemic cancer virus. Aside from that, let me ask you this: Does being a member of the American Legion cause Legionnaire's Disease? Does being a child cause Polio? Does being human cause the Common Cold?"

"How who's looking for a scapegoat? You're trying to wiggle out of the truth. The results of a recent study published in the Journal of American Medicine prove that committing sodomy leads to AIDS."

"The study you're referring to doesn't prove that anal sex leads to AIDS. It supports the theory that the introduction of sperm to the bloodstream through anal intercourse may be related to the development of AIDS. It proves that the body makes antibodies to fight sperm. It showed that a number of persons involved in the study were experiencing a degree of immune system breakdown."

"I rest my case. You've made it for me."

"Not a single one of the participants had AIDS! Not are they expected to get AIDS! They were monogamous couples, that is, faithful lovers."

"They've been lucky. Anyway, we all know how long the faithful part will last."

"Surely you realize that it would take enormous quantities of sperm to stop the immune system from working or so impair its operation that AIDS could occur. Even the most promiscuous gay man would have a hard time indulging in enough sex to seriously effect the fighting power of his immune system. I'm afraid the conclusions you have drawn from this study reflect your prejudice instead of true objectivity."

"Or yours, huh? I think you're missing the point. When the body has to make antibodies to fend off sperm in the blood, it reduces its ability to resist other types of infection. Powerful infections like whatever it is that causes AIDS. If sperm wasn't being pumped into the body several times a day, the strength of the immune system would be good enough to prevent AIDS. So you see, sodomy doesn't promote health, it tears it down. The promiscuous behavior of homosexuals is responsible for spreading AIDS. The disease is epidemic. It kills people and not just homosexuals. Am I getting through to you?"

"If gay men were promiscuous in their behavior, there might be something to what you say. They aren't. Some gay men are promiscuous, that's true. Most are not. There's a relationship between overdoing anything and the increased possibility of suffering ill effects from it. We've known that since the beginning of time. If sodomy helps to cause AIDS, why is it that women who practice anal sex don't have much of a history of AIDS?"

"They do. There was a story about a prostitute with AIDS on 60 Minutes not long ago."

"If I recall the story you're referring to correctly, the lady was also a drug addict. What I'm talking about is women as a group. Healthy, happy, average women who include sodomy in their sexual behavior. Few of them have contracted AIDS. How do you explain that? How do you explain the fact that Haitians are more inclined to catch AIDS than other ethnic groups?"

"I don't have to explain them. They're anomalies or something like that. The fact is that AIDS is epidemic. Epidemic among homosexuals. That makes homosexual behavior a threat to society. It breeds promiscuous, indiscriminate sex and the spread of the disease."

"Epidemic is a medical term, a medical standard. I don't argue with its judgement of the danger we face in AIDS, but I must emphatically point out to you that only a small number of the total gay population is afflicted with AIDS, a very small number. That says something you ought to understand. If promiscuity has anything to do with spreading or catching AIDS, it seems obvious that the vast majority of gay men are either not promiscuous or have extraordinarily effective immune systems. Like Legionnaire's Disease, Polio and many other diseases, AIDS happens to have struck a single group of people, gay men, more intensely than anybody else. That is unfortunate. Blaming the occurrence of the disease on their sexual habits as a group, however, doesn't help to solve the problem. It is as absurd a position to take as blaming the way Chinese people live for the occurrence of Asian Flu or the way all humans live for the annual pandemic occurrence of the Common Cold."

"Baloney! Who do you think you're kidding? Everybody knows that homos are promiscuous and responsible for a whole host of health and moral problems. You're wasting your time trying to cover up their behavior or make it seem normal. You can preach homosexual purity from now until the end of time, but it will still turn out to be dirty slut."

"I see what your problem is. You judge everybody by the behavior of a few if it suits your prejudice. I'll bet you don't judge straights the same way you do lesbians and gay men."

Are most straights promiscuous? Of course, not. How do you know? You know because you're in touch with what's happening to straight people."

"I'll buy that."

"How can you argue that lesbians and gay men are sexually promiscuous and responsible for a host of health and moral problems when it's plain as day you aren't in touch with what's happening to them?"

"It's a well known fact, that's how."

"It's a well known fact to people who know little or nothing about lesbians and gay men. On the average, lesbians and gay men reflect the same moral values as straights and are just as healthy. Their behavior is comparable, not dissimilar, over the entire lifespan. As youths they are inclined to dating, the break-up of relationships and pursuit of new ones. Some lesbian and gay youths are steady as a rock. Others have to sow their oats before setting down. They may get married or stay single. They seek true and lasting love. The divorce rate among lesbians and gay men illustrates the same dissatisfaction with the quality of male relationships as divorce among straights. Some homosexuals live in family like groups sharing each other's interests and goals in life. The children of straight marriages that ended up in divorce sometimes become part of a new family created by homosexual remarriage. Lesbians and gay men aspire to the same things in life straights do."

There are superficial cultural differences here and there, to be sure, but the similarities far outweigh them."

"Hey, calm down now, how can a bunch of perverse sex addicts be like straight, upstanding family folks. It ain't possible. Queers undermine family life. They shop around and play around. In no way are they like members of a family. It's ridiculous to make the comparison."

"So, we're back to queers, faggots and dykes - the bigot mentality?"

"We never left it fellas. You made sure of that. I've been nice to you. I've tried to reason with you, but you're a clever faggot. The Devil's own kind, I guess. You've got a neat answer or holier than thou attitude for every big and little bit of the evil homosexuality really is. Don't you know that incest, child abuse and homosexuality helped wreck every great nation that ever was? What do you think we're facing today? Why do you think our country is going downhill? Because immoral behavior of every kind is allowed to flourish in the name of freedom, that's why. Well, liberty and justice for all can't survive in the absence of moral responsibility. That's a fact of life you faggots are going to have to learn, like it or not. You know what I'm saying is right. You just won't admit it."

"I know that competitive stress and economic distress caused by too many people struggling to get the same things out of life at the same time decreases the real value we put on each other and increases the chance that we will hate and hurt others and be hated and hurt ourselves. This hate and hurt strikes hardest at the family."

"I know that the bigger our population gets, the faster it grows, and that unemployment and underpaid employment grow with it. Not only does the number of people competing for each job go up, the amount of money paid to those who have jobs goes down, slowly, but surely. That not only reduces the standard of living, it impairs our ability to improve the quality of life on a steady basis. If there's any doubt in your mind about how and why the situation works out that way, ask people who were once employed in the steel, auto, textile and appliance industries in this country. Ask unemployed people who have lost their jobs to immigrants willing to work for less money. Ask people who have had to take pay cuts because of foreign competition. Check the number and incomes of permanently unemployed people. Ask the person who has been 1 in 5, 10, a 100 or literally thousands of people applying for the same job or a mere handful of jobs. What kind of feeling do you think is generated in the hearts and minds of persons who have to face that much competition? How long can they or anyone else feel secure in the present or future? We compete on a worldwide basis today. Trade barriers are relatively useless, counter-productive. With population constantly on the rise in most parts of the world, the economic fate of the individual and family is driven ever downward toward a lower and lower standard of living by ever increasing competition by more and more people for every available job. Homosexuality helps to stop that trend and can eventually reverse it because it slows down pop growth."

"I know that unemployment and underpaid employment cause poverty out of which demoralization grows and festers on the social body erupting into running sores of crime, apathy, indiscriminate violence, child and spouse abuse, alcoholism, drug addiction, suicide and mental and physical illness. Greater risk to our personal safety and financial security accompanies the development of these conditions. They threaten the well being of the family and social integrity - not homosexuality which is designed to help prevent their underlying cause - overpopulation - from happening."

"I know that the disillusionment and desperation poverty breeds causes people to organize or join religious and political cults. Our principal adversary in the world today, communism, was born and raised in the poverty excessive pop growth creates. It continues to spread throughout the world for the same reason. Economic instability and political unrest divide society and the world into opposing factions ready and willing to kill each other for the bare necessities of life and its rewards, as well. Lesbians and gay men strive to offer the course of straight reproductive proclivity responsible for the will to go to war by behaving non-reproductively. That helps preserve society and its institutions, including, of course, the family."

"I know that our taxes keep going up and up and government deficit spending keeps rising higher and higher because we have to support more and more people who can't support themselves, and at the same time, keep our armed forces in a constant state of readiness to go to war. The tensions generated by ever growing competition between ever increasing numbers of people in every nation on earth leave us no choice except to lend and spend until the money runs out or war obliterates us. Sure, we could feed, house and clothe every person on earth a couple of times over if it weren't for all the money we spend on military preparedness, but we can't afford not to spend that money until there are fewer people in the world who will try to grab what we've got if they think they can get away with it. Population pressure dictates its own terms, social, economic, political, military, environmental."

"I know that ever increasing pop growth and the ever increasing degree of civilization it takes to accommodate it is contaminating our environment and destroying wildlife, plant and animal, at a faster and faster rate of speed each year. How long human life can survive if we go on poisoning our air, water and food is a matter of debate. The fact that we find ourselves arguing the issue shows how dangerous a position we've put ourselves in."

"I know that if we want to slow down pop growth, repressing homosexual behavior is not the way to do it. Repressing homosexuality speeds up pop growth. The presence of lesbian and gay parents in society proves it. The staggering growth in our population over the last 1700 years from approximately 100 million people to nearly five billion proves it. Throughout that period, every time lesbians and gay men tried to re-assess their population reducing place in society, they were hounded, tortured, beaten, ostracized, jailed and/or

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

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

UNION OFF THE HOOK

WASHINGTON, DC (GCN) - A government worker's union has been cleared of charges that it illegally encouraged its members in a Social Security office to strike when it advised them to "refrain from face-to-face interviews" with people with AIDS who filed claims for benefits, according to the Washington Post.

The workers never went on strike over the issue but the Social Security Administration contended that an American Federation of Government Employees local in New York called for a strike or slowdown when it sent out a precautionary notice about interviews with AIDS claimants to its members.

The union claimed, and the Federal Labor Relations Authority agreed that the instructions were of an informational nature and not a call for a strike. Strikes or slowdowns against the government are illegal.

Before being approved for Social Security benefits, people with AIDS, like all other applicants must be interviewed by Social Security workers.

DELETE THOSE QUEERS

HARRISBURG, PA (GCN) - A newly formed group called Citizens Who Care (CWC) will attempt to replace by petition or referendum their city's law protecting Gay men and Lesbians from discrimination, according to Philadelphia's Gay News.

The groups chairman, Rev. Edgar B. Murphy III, told the Gay News that his organization hopes to replace Harrisburg's ordinance 8 with a "human rights ordinance" that does not mention sexual preference because "we feel no one should have special privileges because of sexual preference." Murphy's ordinance would cover all other categories included in the ordinance, passed by the Harrisburg City Council in March 1983.

Murphy said his group formed in the middle of August after the City Council passed a proclamation which designated August 24 as Gay Pride Day. "Two ladies and myself who had written letters to the (local) paper got together. We prayed and we decided to start the group," said Murphy.

One Gay activist in the area said he didn't anticipate the council "would back down" on Ordinance 8. But if the question takes the form of a ballot referendum, Roger Beatty said Harrisburg's Gay men and Lesbians will "need to broaden our base (of support) because if it comes to the community versus Gays and Lesbians, we won't get anywhere."

FIGHTING THE FIREFIGHTERS

FIGHTING THE FIREFIGHTERS

SAN FRANCISCO, CA (GCN) - The man who was the victim of a physical assault by five San Francisco firemen at a restaurant on October 20 has filed a \$250,000 suit against the city, according to the Bay Area Reporter.

William K. Moore, who is not Gay, alleges that the firemen taunted him with anti-Gay remarks and then punched him repeatedly in the face. Moore says he acted to protect himself and did not attack the firefighters in any way.

The five firefighters have been disciplined - three with suspensions, two with formal reprimands - and two face charges of battery. Also still pending is a police probe of the officers called to quell the melee. The officers refused to enter the restaurant or interview witnesses, and when taken to the nearby firehouse, refused to arrest suspects identified by the victim.

GAY HEALTH Exposure to Immunity

In the past year or so, interest in Gay health has centered around the AIDS crisis and theories concerning etiology and prevention of the disease. Not a week has gone by when we have not read about a new discovery or heard about some young person succumbing to the disease. The community has been well inundated by information about what can be done to prevent the spread of AIDS, but little has been mentioned about what can be done to strengthen and maintain our own immune systems and insure our own good health.

The diseases that plague the Gay community, although not unique, are found in greater frequency than in the heterosexual community. The reason for this being that sexual practices among homosexuals are different and the number of sexual partners often also higher, thereby ensuring a greater chance of exposure to potentially harmful bacteria and viruses.

Our immune system is not indestructible. It functions much like soldiers on a battlefield with the enemy being the attacking bacteria, viruses, fungi and cancer cells. The "overload" theory of AIDS states that with each exposure of the immune system by an offending organism, the system becomes weakened until it finally breaks down - leading to an immunodeficient state. Therefore, if we can limit our encounters with potentially harmful organisms we could help preserve and protect our immune system, and hence our general health.

Exposure to bacteria and viruses is not the situation that tends to weaken the immune system. Another area being researched is the relationship between diet and host resistance. In other words, what role does nutrition play in maintaining a healthy immune system? My investigation into that topic was disappointing and revealed that our knowledge of how diet affects immunity is far from complete. What we do know is that malnutrition will impair T-lymphocyte function and the ability of other white blood cells to migrate to the sites of bacterial and fungal infection, and to kill these harmful invaders.

Deficiencies in vitamins such as folic acid, pyridoxine, vitamins A and C have all been shown, in laboratory experiments, to cause an impairment in the T-lymphocyte response to infection. The mechanisms by which vitamin



deficiencies produce immunodeficiency are not uniform.

The role of trace elements in the regulation of immunity function is also under investigation. Deficiencies in such trace elements as zinc and iron appears to influence immunocompetence, the mechanisms operating are still unclear.

In other experiments, it has been shown that excess cholesterol and large amounts of polyunsaturated fatty acids produce alterations in the anatomy of white blood cells.

What does this all mean? It is very unlikely that nutritional deficiency is the key to the AIDS mystery, but we can postulate that it may facilitate events leading to the establishment of the disease.

Not only is nutrition important, but we must also begin to utilize our knowledge of prevention of the more common infections such as the influenza and cold viruses, gastrointestinal bacterial infections such as Shigella and Campylobacter, and the parasitic infections of Amebiasis and Giardiasis.

Only by decreasing the exposure of our immune systems to these agents and others like them - along with good nutritional support - can we maintain our present state of good health. (Sentinel)



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

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

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

DRONENBERG REHEARING DENIED

WASHINGTON, DC (GCM) - the 11-member Court of Appeals here has refused to review a decision upholding a former Navy petty officer's discharge for having sex with another seaman, according to the Washington Blade.

The ruling lets stand the opinion written last August by Circuit Judge Robert Bork in the case of former petty officer James Dronenberg. Bork contended that Dronenberg and Gay people in or out of the military do not have a constitutional right to private, consensual sexual relations.

Bork wrote that "a right to homosexual conduct is [not] 'fundamental' or 'implicit in the concept of ordered liberty' unless any and all private sexual behavior falls within those categories...."

Four judges dissented with the majority opinion not to review the case and charged the original three judge panel with writing "a twelve-page attack on the right to privacy," and faulted the panel for substituting "its own doctrinal preferences for the constitutional principles established by the Supreme Court."

ON PAIN AND HURT

To be avoided at all cost. For most of us, these two heartaches control our lives. Isn't it about time that we took control of them?

There are, as I see them, two approaches. One easy, one hard. The easy one is the hardest in the long run because it requires only that we stop feeling; stop being vulnerable; turn off; keep it all in; build a wall and keep others out. It ends up drawing us of life. People are feeling animals. We want and need each other; some more, some less, sooner or later. To deny feelings is to deny life. It ends up hurting everyone involved.

But who wants to experience pain? We don't volunteer for it. It is simply a fact of life that somewhere along the line there will be pain. So why not prepare for it? How? Start by realizing a few truths. Pain and hurt can be controlled. Each of us is totally responsible for not only our actions, but our reactions. No one is free until we realize our responsibilities toward our feelings. No one can control you unless you allow it to happen. No one can hurt you unless you choose to react by feeling hurt or pain. It's too easy to blame an outside source for our pain. No matter what is said or done, you ultimately are the final word on how you choose to react. Pain (except physical violence) is usually self-inflicted. It is a truth that is hard to swallow since most of us do not have (or want to have) that much control of ourselves. Are you so willing to let someone else decide things for you. Then indeed, you are a prisoner and you will never experience happiness until it is in your hands and not someone else's.

The hard way is actually the easiest. The trick? See what is

really there. Try honesty and communication. Throw away your rose-colored glasses and stop trying to see what is not there just because you want it to be true. Love is grand when you know it is based on fact, not fiction. Then when you are on could nine, you know you have a concrete base from which to float and return. Anything less breeds insecurity. Pain cannot be avoided even by step #1, for our wall keeps life from reaching us and we slowly die. The pain is simply in smaller doses.

When someone is reaching out to "hurt" you, be aware that they are the one hurting. Care enough to reach out. We tend to take everything personally rather than stepping back to see what's really being said. This works even with total strangers.

Everyone is entitled to their own opinions based on their experiences. You may not know where his head has been. Just listen - he'll tell you. Recently a man approached me at the bar. I never saw him before. "You think your shit doesn't stink?" he said. Having just come out of the men's room, I knew he was wrong, but I realized I had a problem. I knew the truth. What he said was not taken personally, and we sat and talked a bit. He wanted to meet me and out of fear of frustration and possible rejection and other fantasies, he made his statement. He was afraid to meet me because he thought I was so handsome but standoffish. His attempt to cause hurt didn't work.

We choose our reactions. We are all in charge of ourselves, except for those who choose to give up their power to others. They have no one to blame but themselves for their pain or hurt. Choose well.

"I know that the cry for gay/lesbian liberty is more than a minority demand for equal rights and social justice. It is Nature telling us in no uncertain terms to slow down our pop growth and survive as a species or go on increasing it and die! If you really care about yourself, your children and the future of human kind, you should thank your lucky stars for every lesbian and gay person you know or know of and do everything you can to make them feel welcome and wanted in society."
