**Jennifer Holliday to headline  
Gay Games II closing ceremonies August 17**

**SAN FRANCISCO, CA** - Award-winning entertainer Jennifer Holliday will be the featured performer at the closing ceremonies of Gay Games II, Sunday, August 17. Ms. Holliday will be zapping off a week of athletic and cultural events in San Francisco (August 9-17) for the Gay and Lesbian community from across the country and around the world.

Jennifer Holliday first leaped to national prominence in her Tony award-winning performance in "Dreamgirls", one of the most successful shows on Broadway in recent years. Ms. Holliday also won a Grammy award for one of the singles released from "Dreamgirls". Most recently she has appeared in a national touring company of "Sing. Mahalia, Sing" packing houses all across the country.

The closing ceremonies for Gay Games II will be held at Kezar Stadium in Golden Gate Park and will include an array of Gay dancers, cloggers, singers and 500 members of the 15 Lesbian/Gay Bands of America. Over 20,000 spectators are expected to attend. The gates will open at 10:00 a.m. with warm-up festivities set to begin at noon. The closing ceremonies will run from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.

The opening ceremonies on Saturday, August 9, also to be held at Kezar Stadium will feature Rita Mae Brown as Master of Ceremonies. The opening will be highlighted by the triumphant entry of over 3,500 Gay and Lesbian athletes from around the world. The actual final count of confirmed athletes will not be available immediately because of the crush of more than 2,000 entrants signing up in the last

week before the June 1st deadline.

Use of personal computers has helped volunteers handle the tasks of logging entries, mailing confirmations and providing statistical reports to each committee in the organization. Volunteers are working around the clock to keep the entries moving through the registration process in the Games office. Shawn Kelly, Executive Director said, "We are very pleased that our efforts to reach the Gay community have paid off," noting that the Games are open to all athletes regardless of age or ability.

**Supremes let  
Texas sodomy law stand**

**WASHINGTON, DC (AP)** - The Supreme Court on Tuesday, July 7, let stand a Texas law making "deviate sexual intercourse" a crime turning aside arguments that the law violates the privacy rights of homosexuals.

The Justices, over one dissenting vote, rejected a

*The Supreme Court and the sodomy ruling*

It would be very easy to state simply that the date of June 28 will be entered into the history books as a date of great change within the Gay and Lesbian Civil Rights Movement. What will not be easy is the explanation why.

The Supreme Court ruled 5 to 4 to uphold a statute in the state of Georgia which says sodomy is illegal whether practiced by homosexuals or heterosexuals. In this ruling, the Justices have virtually given free reign to law enforcement officials to invade the privacy of consenting adults and to prosecute individuals who engage in sodomy which is defined as "unnatural, especially anal or oral, copulation, copulation of a human with an animal."

CBS Evening News Law Correspondent Fred Graham reported: "A case that began as a Gay Rights Crusade ended in a bitter Supreme Court division over society's right to legislate morality."

Writing the majority opinion, Justice Byron White said it is constitutional for legislatures to outlaw some private conduct solely because a majority of the people consider it immoral and unacceptable. Writing for the minority, Justice Harry Blackmun said the mere fact that certain conduct offends the majority cannot justify invading the homes, hearts and minds of citizens who choose to live their lives differently.

NBC affiliate KPNX-12 reported there was "no record of the (Georgia) law being applied to heterosexuals", while CBS Evening News ended with the comment that "as a practical matter, people are rarely prosecuted under the sodomy laws anyway because of the obvious problems of proof." So the importance of the decision is likely to be mostly psychological, representing a major defeat for homosexuals on the ultimate issue of Gay rights.

I beg to differ.

It was obvious to me during the entire day when I watched various news reports that many newscasters were missing at least part of a very big point, confusing the sexual acts of sodomy with the mental processes involved with being a homosexual.

Whether certain sexual practices are branded illegal or not, this will hardly stop me from being a homosexual. Homosexuality for me is defined by that certain mental need for another man's affection, not some purported physical need for whatever a man has that a woman does not.

Moreover, I think a lot of the newscasters presented the results and apparent effects of this ruling, in a subjective and biased manner, by immediately pointing the finger at homosexuals and saying this ruling adversely affects homosexuals, as if to say heterosexual men and women do not engage in "unnatural, especially anal or oral, copulation".

In Justice Blackmun's dissenting opinion, he further stated, "The Georgia law also

applies to heterosexuals, single or married... Depriving individuals of the right to choose for themselves how to conduct their intimate relationships poses a far greater threat to the values most deeply rooted in our nation's history. I think the court today betrays those values."

What does this mean in the 25 states which now have similar sodomy laws? Laurence Tribe, of the Harvard Law School, who was involved with last year's Oklahoma teacher's case was quoted as saying, "If the privacy of the home, and the inner-sanctum of the bedroom, is not secure from Big Brother, it's really hard to know where the power of government stops."

An extended worse-case scenario is frightening.

At this point it is unclear whether or not law enforcement officials will be enabled to invade the privacy of homosexuals and/or heterosexuals in order to arrest, charge, try and convict "guilty" persons. This ruling could remain a moot point if a search warrant and due-process is required before law enforcement officials can investigate possible infractions of this ridiculous law. After all, one usually gets out of bed before answering the front door.

And this leads me nicely into the other point about the Court's ruling, that being the invasion of privacy, and the regulation of activities between consenting adults.

This whole difficulty with "homosexuality" and "sodomy" and the other mish-mash which came out with this ruling could be easily solved if an umbrella-law were enacted which said, "anything done in the privacy of a home, or bedroom, by two or more consenting adults is legal." (18 little words and our problems would be solved.) Sigh. This law could wipe away any fears about child-molestation (a minor --someone not 18 years of age-- cannot legally give consent, therefore sex with a minor would be illegal); it would also do away with laws preventing homosexuals (and many heterosexuals) from engaging in any and all sexual activities because if two people consent to the act, what's the problem?

It is unfortunate that this ruling came down, because it proves how fully entrenched in "religious" thinking our country has become. The further our legal system sinks into the clutch of this thinking, the fewer and fewer civil rights Gay men and Lesbian women will have. Remember many years ago, in the age of Greeks and Romans, homosexuality was not even noticed as being "unnatural". In fact it was common, and accepted. Many "primitive" cultures --such as those visited, and written about by anthropologist Margaret Mead-- have common, or ritualized homosexuality as part of their cultures. In some Scandinavian countries, (and in Wisconsin) homosexuality is protected, and accepted as routine.

Why then is America so backward? It is sad that a country founded in order to escape "religious persecution", should be so influenced by "religious persecutors".

## RALLY AGAINST CINCY COUNCILMAN

CINCINNATI, OH (AP) - A city councilman who was singled out for criticism by Gay rights activists at a weekend rally said Monday he sees no need to pass laws that legitimize homosexual lifestyles.

Councilman J. Kenneth Blackwell, who is also Cincinnati's vice mayor, responded to comments by Gay Rights leaders who said Blackwell is an enemy of homosexuals who seek the same rights as other citizens.

"My position has been, and continues to be, that I don't believe Gays should be singled out for persecution," Blackwell said. "Neither do I believe that their lifestyle should be given legitimacy over any other lifestyle, through passage of legislation."

Cincinnati Gay rights activists organized last Sunday's rally (July 6) to protest last week's U.S. Supreme Court decision upholding a Georgia law that makes it illegal for anyone, homosexual or heterosexual, to engage in sodomy.

The homosexual activists urged the rally crowd of 200 people gathered outside City Hall to work for the repeal of laws that make it a crime to commit sodomy. They criticized those laws as an attack on the privacy of homosexuals and heterosexuals.

## STATE DENIES QUARANTINE PLANS FOR AIDS-EXPOSED

PHOENIX (AP) - State health officials say they have no plans to quarantine people who have been exposed to acquired immune deficiency syndrome, or AIDS, even though they may have the power to do so.

A newly formed group, the Arizona League Against Homophobia claims, in a widely distributed leaflet headlined "Quarantine, AIDS, and You" that the state Department of Health Services is trying to adopt a regulation that would allow quarantine of anyone who tests positive for the presence of AIDS antibodies.

"Hogwash," said Sherri Raymond, the department's press secretary.

And Dr. Steve Engleander, head of the department's infectious-diseases division, said the group had misunderstood the rule.

The health department already has quarantine powers for infectious diseases such as tuberculosis in which a suspected carrier poses a hazard to the public and does not get treatment. Engleander said. "Those powers are pretty broad and have been widely upheld," he added. But the cases that have surfaced in other states in which a suspected AIDS carrier refused treatment are the sort that police and courts could handle through criminal laws such as prostitution statutes rather than through civil health rules, he said.

"I can't imagine the situation in which we would become involved in that," he said.

The rules the state is trying to adopt would require doctors and others to report all those who test positive for the presence of antibodies to the AIDS virus.



## European media editorials assail Supreme Court sodomy decision

LONDON, ENGLAND (AP) - With the exception of Ireland, Western European countries have enacted no laws against homosexual acts, but few countries explicitly ban discrimination against homosexuals in such areas as jobs and housing.

In the past 25 years, several European nations repealed old laws forbidding homosexual relations, among them Britain, West Germany, Norway and Spain. Most countries now permit any sexual act between consenting people in private. The age of consent ranges from 16 in Italy and Denmark to 21 in Britain.

French law forbids adults to engage in homosexual relations with anyone under the age of 18, but permits two people between the ages of 15 and 18 to have homosexual relations as long as both consent and there is no violence.

The U.S. Supreme Court's recent decision to uphold Georgia's law against sodomy (OBSERVER, July 2), prompted some scathing editorial comment in European newspapers.

Sweden's "Aftonbladet" linked the ruling with President Reagan's appointment of what the paper called "extreme right-wing judges" to the court.

"It is absurd to hold forth a United States ruled by conservatives as an example of freedom, when freedom does not exist in the most private of affairs," said the daily.

Sweden's Ministry of Social Affairs is drafting a bill expected to give homosexual live-in couples the same legal status as unmarried heterosexual couples, who have virtually the same rights as married couples.

An Associated Press sampling of Europe showed that only Switzerland and Norway explicitly ban discrimination against homosexuals. Denmark like Sweden is drafting legislation to protect homosexuals' rights in employment and housing.

Greek law permits homosexual relations, and authorities are generally tolerant of homosexuality. Gay organizations in Athens publish two magazines, demonstrate in support of homosexual prostitutes and hold an annual transvestite beauty contest.

The deadly disease AIDS has hit Europe, provoking some outcry against homosexuality. But no country has taken legal steps restricting the behavior of homosexuals.

In 1967, Britain amended its Sexual Offenses Act to permit homosexual relations between consenting males in private. British law had never banned lesbian relations.

For centuries, until 1836, the death penalty was used to deter sodomy in Britain.

In Ireland, which on June 26 affirmed its adherence to Roman Catholic tenets by voting against divorce in a referendum, homosexual acts are prohibited under laws enacted in 1861 and 1865 during British rule. Convicted offenders could face a

## Majority of Americans disapprove survey shows

NEW YORK, NY (AP) - More Americans disapprove than approve of the U.S. Supreme Court decision upholding a Georgia law making sodomy between consenting adults a felony, (OBSERVER, July 2), according to a Newsweek poll.

But most of those questioned said they disapproved of homosexuality, the magazine reported Sunday.

Forty-seven percent of those surveyed disapproved of last week's ruling, 41 percent approved, and 12 percent had no opinion.

Middle-aged Americans were most upset with the ruling, with 54 percent against it, while those above the age of 50 were more accepting of the decision.

life sentence.

A book called "Out For Ourselves", published by the Dublin Lesbian and Gay Collective comments, "The laws have such wide parameters that they are rarely enforced. But they do provide a backdrop of oppression which affects the way we are treated in our daily lives by the authorities and individuals."

In Italy, the secretary of a homosexual group, who insisted on anonymity, said no specific laws exist there against homosexuality, and even in the Fascist period homosexuals were not prosecuted, though they were harassed.

Italian newspapers gave prominent coverage to the U.S. Supreme Court decision. The moderate "Il Messaggero" paper wrote, "Every state will have to determine what is barred in the bedroom. But who will enforce the law?"

The Netherlands has no legislation banning any sexual conduct in private except incest. In West Germany, homosexual relations have been legal since 1969, and the age of consent is 18.

Under Hitler, tens of thousands of homosexuals were sent to concentration camps and executed.

Switzerland sets different ages of consent, with 20 for homosexual relations and 16 for heterosexual relations. In General Francisco Franco's Spain, police could arrest anyone with a "homosexual appearance," with a two-year prison sentence the maximum penalty. The law was abrogated in 1977, two years after Franco's death.

"Here, at least in private, any sexual act is permitted," Justice Ministry spokesman Francisco Gor said in Madrid.

The leading Madrid daily "El País" called the Supreme Court's ruling "a brutal violation of individual's privacy."

In Belgium, the law does not ban homosexuality, but a case now before the courts has underscored an aversion to homosexuality in the predominantly Catholic country. A man cleared of a charge of running a house of ill repute, a Gay club, was convicted on appeal. The Judge said if homosexuality were left without control, it would mean the extinction of the human race. The case is on appeal to Belgium's Supreme Court.

In Eastern Europe the legal situation varies. In the Soviet Union, homosexuality is punishable by up to eight years in prison. But a book called, "Pink Love Under a Red Star," published by an Austrian Gay rights organization, says Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Bulgaria and Albania have no laws banning homosexuality between consenting adults.

Yugoslavia and Romania outlaw it, the book says.

Homosexuality is more discreetly practiced in the East bloc than in the West, possibly because police in Eastern Europe are generally less tolerant of non-conformity.

With 48 percent disapproving.

Overall, however, 61 percent said they did not regard homosexuality as an accepted alternative lifestyle, while 32 percent said they did and 7 percent did not know.

The poll also said 57 percent of those surveyed did not believe the states should police private sexual practices between consenting homosexuals, while 74 percent said the states should not police heterosexuals' private sex practices.

The survey questioned 611 adults by telephone July 1 and 2. The poll's margin of error was plus or minus 5 percentage points.

SUPREME COURT LETS TEXAS SODOMY LAW STAND ALSO

challenge to the law by a homosexual who said it is unconstitutional.

They also turned down appeals by Texas state and local law enforcement officials over procedural aspects of the law.

The court last week upheld a Georgia law making sodomy a crime, ruling that it did not violate any constitutional right.

The Texas law is similar to Georgia's. It defines deviate sexual intercourse as "any contact between any part of the genitalia of one person and the mouth or anus of another person."

Donald F. Baker, who sued over the law, said it violates his right to engage in homosexual activities. He sought to have the law overturned even though he was not prosecuted for homosexual conduct.

The 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals upheld the law last August. It said the ban on deviate sexual intercourse is justified by "the strong objection to homosexual conduct which has prevailed in Western culture for the past seven centuries."

The appeals court also rejected arguments by Texas prosecutors over who has the right to defend and challenge the state law in federal court.

Attorney General Jim Mattox, said his office has the exclusive power to represent the state's interest in such cases. District Attorney's in Texas said Baker had no legal standing to file his suit.

Justice Thurgood Marshall voted to hear arguments in the Texas case.

## LANDSCAPING MADE SIMPLE - PART 2

## FIRST BLOOD

For all you people out there who think I am just some cigarette smoking, drink sucking wimp - you've got another thing coming. I have been feeling inadequate lately, you know, that vague feeling that though you can get it up, you're not sure how high up is.
