Gay law attacked in Wisconsin

MADISON, WI (BAR) - Former Green Bay Packers quarterback Bart Starr is leading a blitz against the Wisconsin Gay-rights law. With him at the line of scrimmage are fundamentalist Christians and right-wing Republicans - including the new Wisconsin governor. The defenders are on the run.

The Bart Starr squad already has forced dismemberment of a statewide Gay council. And last year, they came within five votes in the 100-member Assembly in their effort to weaken the law. They're at it again this year. With conservative Tommy Thompson now in the governor's office, they have more muscle in the front line.

"We are quite concerned," said Dane County (Madison) Superintendent Richard Wagner, who is openly Gay. "If they get it out of committee, it will be a nip and tuck battle."

In 1982, Wisconsin became the only state to prohibit discrimination against Gay and Lesbian citizens. Assembly Bill 70 added the clause "sexual orientation" to the state law against discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodations, licensing and union membership.

Wisconsin's anti-bias law is more than just a paper tiger. The state Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations has the power to investigate discrimination and enforce sanctions against violators, and it often uses that power.

Since the Gay-rights law was signed by moderate Republican Gov. Lee Dreyfus five years ago, the state has pursued dozens of cases against employers and others who were charged with discriminating against Gays.

The Gay-rights law was strongly back by progressive Democratic Gov. Tony Earl, elected in 1982 and defeated last year. Earl was the most pro-Gay governor in the nation. He appointed an openly Gay press secretary and formed a statewide Gay and Lesbian council to oversee implementation of the anti-discrimination law.

But Earl's progressive coalition unraveled in the 1986 election. Conservative Republican Tommy Thompson - who made the Gay council an issue in the campaign - defeated the incumbent by a 52-48 percent margin.

"The new governor has made it clear in his campaign that he would abolish the Gay and Lesbian council," said Wagner, who was a founding member of the council and a close advisor to former Gov. Earl.

Rather than be fired, council members quit. They resigned en masse the week before Gov. Thompson was inaugurated.

The council was a key force in implementing the Gay-rights law, even though it was not formally a part of the legislation. Council members held

town forums throughout Wisconsin publicizing the law. They told Gays and Lesbians how to file complaints, and they told local governmental officials and business leaders what they were required to do in order to comply with the law.

Thus, the council was the most visible target for those who opposed the Gay-rights law. Gov. Thompson's threats against the council were just the first play in a bigger blitz to undo all legislative gains made by Gays in Wisconsin.

"In his campaign, Tommy Thompson portrayed Tony Earl as a social engineer - and the Gay-rights law was part of that," said Wagner. "He publicly attacked the Gay-Lesbian council on a number of occasions."

Thompson previously served in the Assembly, representing a conservative district from the northeastern part of the state. In the Assembly, Thompson pushed a bill to weaken the Gay-rights law - a repeal that nearly passed last year, and may pass in 1987.

The repeal measure is called the "Rawhide Bill". It is named for a boy's camp not far from Green Bay which is championed by Super Bowl hero Bart Starr. In the northeastern half of Wisconsin, Bart Starr is second only to God, and then not by much.

Rawhide Boy's Ranch is not a religious institution but it is run by a religious institution - a fundamentalist Christian church. The distinction is important. The anti-bias law makes an exemption for churches per se. For example, the Catholic Archdiocese of

REPUTED LESBIAN FORCED TO QUIT JOB

CHARLESTON, WV (CCN) This state's Supreme Court has ruled against reinstatement for a teacher who was pressured to resign due to allegations of Lesbianism, according to the Washington Blade. The high court's decision upheld a lower court's ruling.

In 1983, Linda Conway, a teacher at a kindergarten in Hampshire County, resigned after the local community rallied against her. Parents had been complaining about her "masculine" appearance since 1980, as well as about her alleged relationship with another female teacher. In 1982, the parents circulated a petition condemning Conway's "way of life [as] not morally acceptable or in the best interest of the children." Subsequently, 400 people attended a county school board meeting to oppose Conway's continued employment as a teacher.

At the same time, the state Attorney General issued an opinion that school boards had the right to ascertain a teacher's sexuality from public opinion alone and the right to dismiss any reputed homosexual on grounds of immorality.

In Conway's appeal to the state Supreme Court, she argued that her resignation occurred under duress, that the jury in the lower court had not been adequately instructed about the law of duress, and that she was entitled to reinstatement and back pay.

Her attorney, Robert Bastress, argued that the state Attorney General's opinion and the resulting court decision granted the school board "a carte blanche for arbitrariness... [which] will necessarily chill teachers from exercising their constitutional and statutory rights." He also argued that community beliefs and "mere opinion" had been given unprecedented power to "terminate teachers and ruin their livelihood."

The state Supreme Court upheld the lower court ruling against Conway, stating that they could not conclude that "the jury verdict was contrary to the evidence nor that the trial court erred in instructing the jury."

LEGAL ABORTIONS FAVORED BY WOMEN
NEW YORK, NY (AP) - Women overwhelmingly support the legal right to an abortion, and more than half would have one, a New Woman magazine survey of 14,000 readers shows. Only 21 percent said they wouldn't have an abortion, although 42 percent of those still support others' right to choose.

If abortions were banned in the United States and they faced an unwanted pregnancy, 25 percent said they would seek an illegal operation, 26 percent would travel outside the United States for a legal one, 23 percent would have the baby and 28 percent were undecided.

GAY GROUP AT ASU FILES BIAS SUIT
PHOENIX (AP) - Gay activists at Arizona State University have filed a federal lawsuit seeking to force the ASU Student Senate to provide funds they claim have been denied to a Gay-students group for the last three years.

The student government has repealed a bylaw that had denied funding to the organization, but Craig Mehrens, the attorney for the Lesbian and Gay Academic Union, said he would follow through on the suit.

In denying funding for LGAU forums and speakers during the last three years, student senators based their decision on bylaws that prohibited funding any club that "aligns ASASU into biased sponsorship of a controversial matter."

 Milwaukee - which in fact, supported the Gay-rights law in 1982 - could not be ordered to hire Gay staff members.

But social services agencies run by a church are covered by the law. Rawhide Ranch falls into that category. It receives much of its funding - and many of its referrals of delinquent youths - from the state.

"The Rawhide Ranch has refused to comply with the State Fair Employment Law, which includes sexual orientation, and it has made a point of that refusal," Wagner said.

Bart Starr held televised press conferences pushing the "Rawhide Bill" and attacking the Gay-rights law. The Rawhide Bill would exempt any non-profit organization with a "sincerely held religious belief" from being covered by the fair employment law.

Although the Rawhide Bill attacks only one aspect of the Gay-rights law, it opens the door for wholesale repeal. If the bill wins strong support in the Wisconsin Legislature, amendments could be added to gut the Gay-rights law entirely. Gov. Thompson has privately said he would support such an effort.

Defenders of the anti-discrimination law have reason to be worried. Last year, the "Rawhide Bill" passed the Senate and won approval in the Assembly by one vote - before being blocked on a second Assembly vote with five votes to spare.

The leadership of the Assembly hopes to keep the Rawhide Bill in corral - and with long-time Gay rights champion David Clarenbach now serving as Speaker Pro Tem, the pro-Gay

leaders have considerable clout.

But in Wisconsin, with its volatile mix of right-wing conservatism and left-wing progressivism - and little in the middle - anything could happen next.

IS 'EX-GAY' GAY AGAIN?
READING PA (BAR) - According to Colin Cook, Gay men and Lesbians can be "converted" to straight sex. Cook founded the Quest Learning Center, an ex-Gay "ministry", as well as the group, Homosexuals Anonymous, to make his point.

However, the darling of the Fundamentalists had a little problem: he couldn't keep his hands off men.

Amid allegations of sexual improprieties with counselees, Cook resigned his position as director of the Quest Learning Center. Cook sent a letter to Neal Wilson, president of the General Conference of Seventh Day Adventists, the primary financial backer of the Center. Cook sent his resignation in response to a letter sent to Wilson by Dr. Ron Lawson, a sociology professor at Queens College in New York.

Lawson said he had interviewed 14 men who had complained about intense sexual pressure everytime Cook interviewed them. According to Lawson, 13 of the men interviewed said Cook would begin every session with a "long erotic crotch-to-crotch hug, during which time he would get an erection."

Lawson said the only person who didn't get the attention of Cook was a man in his 50's, who according to Lawson, "was probably out of the range of attractiveness as far as he was concerned."



A View From Within

AIDS II: THE SEQUEL "THE STRAIGHT PLAGUE"

"The sad thing is thanks to queers, whores and drug users, innocent people (such as children) must suffer from a fatal disease."

"I would not knowingly treat a homosexual patient with AIDS, but I would treat patients who got the disease by blood transfusion and I would treat children with AIDS."

"Homosexuality is a sin, deserving the death penalty!"

"We used to hate faggots on an emotional basis. Now we have good reason."

--Quoted from the January 1987 issue of MD Magazine. All quotes are from doctors responding to a questionnaire in the same magazine. The questionnaire sought to "poll... American doctors on [their] attitudes about AIDS."

Where there is smoke, there often can be found a fire. In this case, where there is bad news to report, there is also some good news. First, the bad news:

On Nov. 8, 1986, the Associated Press reported the discovery of a second, equally-deadly AIDS virus. The new virus, tagged LAV-II, had at that time been found in fewer than 100 persons. (The current AIDS virus is LAV-I. Both names given by their discoverer, Dr. Luc Montagnier of the Pasteur Institute in Paris.

Currently found only in Africa and Europe, LAV-II has not

yet been discovered in the United States.

More bad news: The Associated Press announced, in a released dated Feb. 15, 1987, that a French researcher has discovered that this new AIDS virus cannot be detected with conventional tests for AIDS. In other words, LAV-II is just as deadly as LAV-I, yet cannot be detected in any already known ways.

LAV-II, which Montagnier called, "as dangerous as the first one," brings with it some news which will be comforting to us all. I quote from the Associated Press release of Nov. 8, 1986: "The new virus infects men and women, can be transmitted by heterosexual contact, and seems to have been spread by a blood transfusion...." Further, Dr. Montagnier said, "It has not been detected in homosexual men or intravenous drug users."

I don't want to drive home this point too pointedly, but in case you did not understand the significance of this fact: the discovery of a second AIDS virus -- one which has no direct relationship with homosexuality -- proves beyond any shadow of a doubt that Gays are NOT responsible for the creation of the current AIDS crisis.

True, our sexual activities may have helped spread the advance of the disease, but how were we to know our sexual activities were so deadly? Did we not -- once we found out about AIDS -- actively change our sexual habits? Dr. Mervyn Silverman, on the ABC show 20/20 which aired Feb. 12, said

that new cases of reportable sexually-transmitted-diseases have decreased among Gay men in San Francisco a full 90%. This shows how concerned we have become with changing our sexual activities; a decrease of reportable sexually-transmitted-diseases means a decrease in sexual activity which could spread these diseases, therefore a change in sexual habits.

Gay communities across the country were the first to push for increased funding for AIDS research; we pushed for safe sexual practices; we educated our own. Now, all these years since AIDS was first discovered, the heterosexual communities are scrambling around trying to get money for research, education, and information on safe sexual practices because this hideous disease is now affecting them! All the while blaming "queers" and "faggots" for their plight.

All the while, we were insisting that AIDS was not our fault, that we were innocent bystanders just like everyone else. But would they listen to us? Of course not. We knew AIDS was going to spread into their world just as it had spread into ours. We tried to help them to help themselves. We suffered their insults and injustices while trying to cope with this horrid disease with no compassion or understanding from them.

And now the tables have turned.

Sure, they will find some way to pin this one on us too. The proof exists that LAV-II is spreading amongst and killing straight men and women -- and NOT homosexuals. But there are those who will ignore the facts and blame us. They were the ones who ignored the facts about the current AIDS virus. They were the ones who wanted to exterminate

homosexuals -- or at least isolate us all on a deserted island somewhere.

But the facts will remain: LAV-II is currently not found in homosexuals at all, anywhere in the world.

Oh, and as for those doctors, those educated men and women whom I quoted at the beginning of this column. I feel sorrow for them. Sorrow that supposedly educated, intelligent persons can be so blind to the rational facts. And sorrow for whichever group they and anyone else now choose to blame, for they no longer can blame us.

(The best summation of the battle to discover the secret of AIDS, can be found in the January 12, 1987 issue of New York Magazine. The cover story, "Fighting AIDS," sums up much of the research that has been done and is being done).



"Homosexuality 'not acceptable', Mecham says on radio." This is a headline that was buried on page four of section B in the Arizona Daily Star on February 13, 1987. The article went on to say our illustrious Governor belongs to a church (Mormon) that does not allow homosexuals to participate in any way. Mecham says there is also no place for homosexuals in government, and homosexuality is just a plain "unacceptable" lifestyle.

After reading this travesty, about an elected public official who is supposed to represent "the people" lambasting a whole group of people unlike him (we can only assume), I started to write a sarcastic, biting, tongue-in-cheek piece about Gov Ev's homophobia. In that mathematical faux pas, however, lies some hope for a solution. What say that "fleeting" ten percent rally to the cause and start signing petitions for a recall?

There is an effort currently underway for a recall gubernatorial election, and in order for that to be accomplished, a certain number of voting Arizonans must sign petitions. Why not start a petition in the Gay community contributing to that effort. Such stupidity in government should not go ignored, especially when a very important minority group does in fact have the voting power to make the difference.

What follows criticism from the highest office in the state? Police raids on Gay bars. Legislation against anyone who doesn't fall into the conservative, God-fearing mold? Who knows, but this is something the Gay community cannot afford to find out.

Sign the recall petitions. Write letters to your legislators. Protest this incredible threat to freedom. It is only through the use of our constitutional rights that we prevent them from atrophy.

Public officials are supposed to be there for the people. For ALL the people, and not just a few. And certainly not just for those whose romantic relationship preference is only for the opposite sex.

GULPING DOWN LIQUEUR RISKY
BOSTON, MA (CON) - Drinking fancy liqueurs slowly makes them last longer and apparently also is safer than bolting them down, doctors say.

In a letter to the New England Journal of Medicine, doctors described a young man who gulped down - and inhaled - liqueur at a party.

"While drinking in this manner, he began to choke and cough repeatedly," they wrote. A few hours later, he began to spit up blood.

The doctors eventually dubbed this condition "liqueur lung," but at first they weren't sure what was wrong. However, after more tests, they blamed the problem on the man accidentally having gotten liqueur up his nose.

The doctors, Rick Conetta and colleagues from New Rochelle Hospital Medical Center in New York, noted that liqueurs often are highly acidic and might cause hemorrhaging of the lungs. The liqueur guzzler got better in a few days, and he has been free of symptoms for two years.

WHAT'S UP DOC?

This week's column is devoted to the Tucson Knight Owl's 'Closet Ball'. Due to a few major changes, I felt I would spell them out, plus give an overall picture as to what the Closet Ball is all about.

Before I get into that, don't forget SOS's "Hoe Down" at IBT's this Sunday starting at noon. This sounds as if it's going to really be a fun day for all who stop by. Check IBT's ad in this issue for further details.

Now on to the Closet Ball. The Closet Ball is set up yearly, primarily for those individuals who have often wondered just what they would look like in drag. This is the opportunity for those people to do so. Comical drag (unshaven) does not count in this case - such as a Halloween drag costume.

For those of you who have just recently moved to Tucson, and at your previous location appeared in serious drag, or appeared in drag shows in drag, this contest is not for you. If you were in drag under different circumstances, either check with me or Tommy Marlin for an official TKO ruling.

The following are general and specific rules governing both the contestants, sponsors and/or make-up artists:

First, the sponsor can also be the make-up artist or they can enlist the help of someone else to do the making up of the contestant. If the sponsor does enlist another person to do the make-up, that person's name and signature should also appear on the application. In either case, the sponsor and make-up artist can only sponsor and/or work on one contestant.

When it comes to the dressing room and the transformation period, only one contestant and one make-up artist will be allowed in the dressing room. After the contestants transformation, the make-up artist will be allowed to leave the dressing room, but the contestant must remain until called for by the judges on stage.

A TKO door monitor will strictly enforce both this rule and all other rules pertaining to the Closet Ball. Any deviation or infraction of these rules observed by the door monitor could cause disqualification of both the contestant and make-up artist, with no refund of the entry fee.

All contestants and make-up artist should arrive at Colette's no later than 7 p.m. with all needed materials for the contestants appearance in this years Closet Ball, and place said items in the dressing room. As stated before a TKO member will be

at the dressing room to let you in and to watch over your supplies for safe keeping.

The make-up artist is only allowed to work with one contestant. Verbal instructions in minor ways will be allowed at the discretion of the TKO monitor. This also applies to the contestants (zipping up a fellow contestants dress is ok but helping in any other way (make-up or hair) is not allowed).

All materials needed by each contestant can be supplied by either the contestant, the sponsor, the make-up artist or a combination thereof. If either the sponsor or make-up artist supplies everything for the contestant, the contestant should share the expenses of material supplied.

Any drinks ordered by the contestant and make-up artist must be paid for by them at the time of ordering. The waiter/waitress will not be asked to look for someone out in the audience for the money, so have money with you in the dressing room.

As a final reminder, this years Closet Ball is being held at Colette's West, on Saturday, March 14, starting at 7:30 p.m. Entry Fees (\$15.00) and all applications must be submitted and received by TKO no later than March 8. No applications will be accepted after that date or at the Closet Ball itself. Make all entry fees (checks or money orders) payable to the Tucson KNight Owls. Any further questions concerning this year's Closet Ball should be directed my myself (Doc) or Tommy Marlin.

The following are specific rules governing both the sponsor, make-up artist and the contestant:

- (A) SPONSOR:
1. Can only sponsor one contestant.
 2. Responsible for entry fees, paid by either themselves or the contestant.
 3. Make sure the contestant arrives on time.

- (B) MAKE-UP ARTIST:
1. Does all facial (and body if needed) make-up.
 2. Does all fix-up work on hair and style.
 3. Arranges for proper appearance of contestants clothing and hair.

THE WEEKLY OBSERVER

(C) CONTESTANT:

1. Do their own shaving.
2. Puts on all basic clothing (under garments).
3. Puts on all other clothing with assistance from sponsor or make-up artist.

Good luck to every contestant from all of TKO. One bit of information to each contestant: a TKO member will be this year's head judge to explain all rules, requirements, etc. to the fellow judges.

RUBBERTALK II

Hi folks. Rubbertalk time again. It's been in the papers. The hot topic of talk shows. Special segments, newslines and magazine discourses are all talking rubbers. What are they all talking about is whether or not they should talk about rubbers! Such controversy! Meanwhile, back in reality, all we want to know is how to protect ourselves from the rapidly spreading Human Immunodeficiency Virus. AIDS.

The controversy lies in the perception that condoms are meant for birth control. Now, birth control can be a pretty hot issue for some people, seeing as anal intercourse, oral intercourse, homosexuality and special postures have been popular methods to achieve satisfaction while avoiding conception since ancient times, according to the Encyclopedia Britannica. (No, there weren't pictures of those special postures). This rubbertalk is for everyone.

Let's start with where to get our little latex lifesavers. Drug stores are the first place to come to mind. They usually have a selection that will satisfy the most discriminating of customers. The marketing masters of Madison Avenue know there are potentially tens upon tens of millions of closet condom consumers out here, so now rubbers are for sale in places like the grocery store. English muffins, condoms and cucumbers. Some of the 7-11s carry them as do some Circle K stores.

You might have to ask for them at the "convenience" stores. Something to do with the "kids" stealing them off the shelves, so they keep rubbers behind the counter. In Tucson, it's easy to ask your bartender for a couple of Gold Coins, and you'll get, for a mere twenty-five cents, 2 easy-open, highly rated medium size rubbers, ready to be lubed and used. The Federal Drug Administration has strength requirements for American made condoms. When asked about the imported rubbers, the girl at the FDA said she'd have to mail me that information. This should be interesting.

No matter where you get your favorite variety of condoms, in actual use you will need extra lubrication. Even if they are pre-lubed, more lubrication is a must. Always a water-based lube. The shelf life of a condom is said to be about 5 years, with deterioration beginning after about 2 1/2 years. A lube other than water-based will start the deterioration immediately. You might not be able to watch the latex dissolve, and then again you might. Included with this article is a list of lubes. There are other water-based lubes also available.

Some of these lubricants have an ingredient called Nonoxynol-9. It is a sperm killing chemical that also kills HIV in the test tube. Some people have had allergic type reactions to Nonoxynol-9, but most do not. A condom, used correctly, is an efficient barrier against HIV. The worst case HIV infection is AIDS. By always using condoms, you protect yourself and the other person from being exposed, or re-exposed to HIV. Re-exposure could have worse results than an initial exposure.

Try different types of rubbers. You can get a list of available condoms from the Tucson AIDS Project office. Who would






RUBBERTALK II

have thought rubbers came in so many sizes and shapes, not to mention the options like colors and pleasure bumps! The people who put this list together belong to a group of researchers. That must have been some fun research project! As far as price of rubbers go, you'll find they range from our Gold Coins - a mere 2 for .25, to around \$1.50 apiece for the deluxe models. Still inexpensive for the protection they afford us.

Here are some practical condom tips:

1. Have a supply of different sizes of condoms readily available. You may not know the best size for who knows who, so be prepared. Heat and light can rapidly age a rubber, so don't keep them in your glove box or wallet for long periods of time.

2. Open the package carefully. No need to test the rubber by inflating or stretching it, that could just weaken it.

3. Before putting the condom on, you might want to put a dab of water-based lube in the tip to increase sensation without causing slippage.

4. As you begin to put the condom on, gently squeeze out the air bubbles. If you are using a rubber without a receptacle tip, leave some room (about 1/2 inch) at the end to hold what's cumming. If there is foreskin, pull it back before unrolling the rubber. Air bubbles can cause a rubber to break, so make sure all the air is squeezed out.

5. Unroll the rubber all the way to the base. This is easiest done when the penis is fully hard, but if it is still soft, just keep checking and unrolling the rubber to the base.

6. Use that water-based lube. Don't be shy, use plenty of it. If the lube begins to get sticky, add a little water from a squeeze or spray bottle or squirt gun. Something that keeps the water clean and fresh. Keep checking the rubber to make sure it is still at the base of the penis.

7. When it's time for withdrawal, hold the base of the rubber as you pull out to avoid spillage or leaving the rubber inside. Perfect! Now throw the rubber away. Under no circumstances will we use the same rubber more than once.

You probably won't find a description on how to use a rubber in the popular press; so keep this as reference and share it with friends. All friends. If you'd






