## Matlovich Claims Gay Vet Memorial

WASHINGTON, DC - San Francisco - Gay activist Leonard Matlovich has claimed the "Gay Vietnam Veteran" burial stone at the Congressional Cemetery in Washington, D.C. "I had hoped to keep my identity a secret," Matlovich told the Sentinel. "However, after I got AIDS, things began to move along a little faster than I had anticipated."

Matlovich, who in 1975 became the first active duty member of the military to declare his homosexuality, said he intends the stone to serve as an "historic symbol" of Gays who fought for Gay rights during their lifetime. Matlovich is also one of the founding members of Never Forget, a national organization dedicated to creating monuments to Lesbians/Gays nationwide.

The stone erected in December, 1986 bears Matlovich's date of birth and the inscription,

"When I was in the military they gave me a medal for killing two men and a discharge for loving one." Matlovich explained the symbolism behind the two pink triangles inscribed on the stone. "The inverted triangle is symbolic of Gays persecuted in Nazi concentration camps during World War II and in military terms pointing down means defeat. The pink triangle on the right side of the stone symbolizes positive advancements and in the military mind pointing up means victory."

Matlovich said he plans to be buried at the Congressional Cemetery, located near RFK stadium. The cemetery, the first Congressional Cemetery, was founded in 1807 and includes graves of many of the members of the First and Second Continental Congress, 76 Congressmen, numerous cabinet members, diplomats, military officers, and former FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover and his lifelong friend Clyde Tolson.

## National AIDS leaders plan White House demonstration

WASHINGTON, DC - A coalition of national, state and local AIDS leaders will demonstrate in front of the White House on Monday, June 1 to dramatize their anger and frustration over President Ronald Reagan's failure to exercise leadership in responding to the AIDS crisis.

Among demonstrators will be the nation's leading AIDS and Gay and Lesbian rights activists, coming together for the first time in the AIDS crisis in a show of united opposition to present national AIDS policy. They have formed the Coalition for Leadership on AIDS to conduct the event.

The demonstration is planned to coincide with the opening day of the Third International Conference on AIDS, which begins that day at the nearby Washington Hilton.

"People are literally dying

of red tape," said Vic Basile, Executive Director of the Human Rights Campaign Fund, the national political action committee for the Gay and Lesbian community, and a lead organizer of the demonstration.

"Time is running out for millions of men and women infected with the AIDS virus," Basile said. "The question is, will they live or die? Has this government committed itself to the strongest possible response, or has it resigned itself to letting the epidemic run its course while the bureaucracy behaves as though it's business as usual? Right now, we have too many indications that it's the latter."

The demonstration will include a procession to Lafayette Park from the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church. The activists will gather at the park for

### Is Jim Bakker Really Tammy Faye?

Charges that televangelist Rev. Jim Bakker is Gay flew about like faeries' wings in the corporate takeover of the multi-million dollar PTL Club. The accusation was another in a series of charges attempting to discredit Bakker and assure he would lose control of his religious broadcast empire.

Homosexual activity has always been a workable gimmick when fundamentalists have desired to be effective in reaching either for power or money. Televangelists Jimmy Swaggart and Jerry Falwell have possibly raised more funds than any person by riding the Gay lifestyle theme. Following the demise of Anita Bryant, Falwell was able to gain new financial wizardry at the expense of Gay people.

With the help of a Rev. John Ankerberg, Falwell and Swaggart were again making the evening news, talking about the evils of being Gay. Ankerberg appeared on the Larry King Live show on the Cable News Network. He said that Jim Bakker had "engaged in homosexual acts." Ankerberg said he had proof though he would name no person and there was no substantiation of the charge.

Nevertheless, it provided the ammunition for Falwell and Swaggart to give a literal definition to the "unforgivable sin". Evangelist Jimmy Swaggart said, "The Assemblies of God (Bakker's denomination) will not allow anyone to come back if they lose their papers over homosexuality. There is no rehabilitation process for this sin. God can forgive it, certainly, if the person is sincere, but ... very few ever make it out."

Jewry Falwell was quick to respond that the Assembly of God provides for restoring the ministry of a fallen pastor whose troubles were brought on by alcohol or family problems. However, he said, "they allow no recovery for those who engage in homosexual acts."

To add further fuel to the verbal fag-bashing, reports were allowed to leak that the PTL Club in Fort Mill, SC, was receiving inquiries about whether Jim Bakker even had AIDS.

The charge of being Gay is homophobic and unquestionably discriminatory. In this case it is also calculated. There is a corporate takeover now in progress with millions of dollars at stake.

To be successful, those involved use the weapons they know best - character assassination. To date, Jim and Tammy Bakker have been accused, without substantiation, of mismanagement of funds, payment of hush money, prostitution, wife-swapping, infidelity, alcoholism and excessive salaries.

The accusers know they will never be able to prove all their charges. Yet the charges are made

because what is at stake is a business with a budget of \$172 million a year.

Bakker has made the statement saying he had never gone to a prostitute and "I am not, nor ever have been, a homosexual." He continued, "Those who say such things should have the accusers come forward and give their names and prove their accusations."

Predictably, Rev. Jerry Falwell has announced that the Bakkers have been financially cut from the PTL Club and that he is now solely in charge.

### AIDS vaccine may not be so hard

LOS ANGELES, CA (AP) - A study that shows different strains of the AIDS virus display common, vulnerable "soft spots" suggests that developing a vaccine to prevent the deadly disease may be easier than previously believed, researchers report.

"It suggests that we may not need to make 100 vaccines against 100 strains. It is quite possible that one vaccine can protect against many strains," said Dr. David D. Ho, whose study with seven other researchers was published May 15 in the Journal of Virology.

Doubts over the ease of developing an AIDS vaccine have arisen "because we have so many different varieties of HIV (human immuno-deficiency virus) and because some of them are so different one vaccine may not protect against infection by different strains," Ho, director of the AIDS virology laboratory at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, said.

But Ho said he and his colleagues "found the weak spots within the virus to attack, and three of the four are common to all strains of the virus" that have been analyzed.

"This is one small piece in a jigsaw puzzle," said Harvard University's Dr. Martin Hirsch, a co-author of the study and virology director at Massachusetts General Hospital.

"It's encouraging, but we have a long way to go," Hirsch said. "We shouldn't raise people's hopes too high. It will be years, if ever, before we have a successful vaccine."

There are perhaps hundreds of strains of HIV-1, as the AIDS virus is now known. French and American researchers are debating whether acquired immune deficiency syndrome also is caused by the more distantly related HIV-2 now spreading through West Africa. Ho said if HIV-2 does cause AIDS, a separate vaccine probably would be needed because it is so different from various HIV-1 strains.

## PHOENIX LESBIA/GAY PRIDE RALLY

PHOENIX - The Phoenix Lesbian and Gay Pride Committee decided at their meeting on May 14 that there will be a rally at the Wesley Bolin Memorial Plaza across from the State Capitol on Sunday, June 14 from 5 to 9 p.m. The theme for 1987 is "Silent No More".

There will be speakers, music, dancing and booths at the Plaza. There will be a \$25 charge for business booths. The objective of the booths is to enable businesses to display their brochures or other information. Businesses may also sell merchandise. There will be a "safe area" in which tables or people will not be filmed by TV cameras. Electricity will not be provided. No liquor sales will be permitted. Food sales will be allowed only if the business has a valid food permit.

Businesses interested in having a table at the rally, please contact Bj Bud at 246-8277 before June 10. Tables will be permitted only if they have prior approval and have paid. Each business is responsible for bringing their own table and chairs. Space is reserved on a first come, first served basis.

It is the hope of the committee that many of the businesses in town can use the rally to spread the word about their businesses so that we all can benefit. Committee membership is open to the general public, as are the meetings.

## PIMA COUNTY LISTS 50 CASES OF AIDS

TUCSON - More than 200 AIDS cases have been reported in Arizona, state officials say.

The Department of Health Services reports that 207 Arizonans have contracted acquired immune deficiency syndrome. The agency said 140 of the 207 victims have died and the vast majority of the Arizona cases involve males, most of them Anglo.

Of the total cases, 145 were reported in Maricopa County, 50 in Pima County and the remainder in other counties across the state.

## WHATEVER HAPPENED TO SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND STATE?

KANSAS CITY, MO (BAR) - It's obvious everything is not up to date in Kansas City.

A Jackson County judge ruled recently that a divorced lesbian could have children for an overnight visit only if the lesbian's lover was not present. Nothing that gay sex is a crime in Missouri, the judge said, "the children would be subjected to a lifestyle which is in conflict with the values they are being taught in school and in church."

## SWISS LESBIANS WIN COURT BATTLE

GENEVA, SWITZERLAND (GCN) - Three of the organizers for last year's International Lesbian Conference have been acquitted of police charges of demonstrating without a permit.

According to 'Outwrite' of London, the women had organized a demonstration for lesbians' right to political asylum. When summoned to court on the charges, they argued that police were attempting to limit their freedom of expression. The court acquitted the lesbian organizers, and instructed Swiss police to pay all court costs incurred by the three women.

**KOOP TELLS IT TO REV. JERRY LYNCHBURG, VA (BAR)** - Rev. Jerry Falwell was caught off guard recently by U.S. Surgeon General C. Everett Koop. The latter was a guest speaker at Falwell's Liberty University.

With Falwell by his side, Koop told the college students that they too could contact AIDS. Falwell, who earlier had said that gays "who choose to violate God's law bring retribution on themselves," appeared to back down from the statement. He urged his student robots to show "concern about the welfare of all".

Who wants to take bets that Koop doesn't get invited back to speak at Liberty University again?

## LEGACY OF HARDWICK

GAINESVILLE, GA (GCN) - Two men were recently fined, placed on probation and ordered to perform community service after a state court found them guilty of violating the Georgia sodomy law upheld last year in Bowers v. Hardwick.

According to a UPI report, a 28-year-old Bill Stewart of Cleveland, Georgia was sentenced in December to 200 hours of community service, ordered to pay a \$1,000 fine, and placed on probation for 10 years.

Doyle Lamar Self, 41, of Jackson County, was sentenced to 100 hours of community service, fined \$1,000 and placed on probation for seven years.

## GAY MEN HAVE REDUCED NEW SEXUAL ENCOUNTERS

ATLANTA, GA (AP) - The vast majority of homosexual and bisexual men surveyed in San Francisco have cut down on casual sex partners in the wake of the growing AIDS epidemic, the national Centers for Disease Control reported.

The 126 men, first interviewed in the late 1970's in a study of hepatitis B infections, reported noticeable changes in sexual behavior when they were interviewed again between 1983 and 1985 after increased publicity about acquired immune deficiency syndrome, the CDC reported.

The average number of "non-steady" partners - involved in only one or two sexual encounters in four months - dropped from 29 percent in 1978 to 15 in 1984 and six in 1985.

Over all, 90 percent of the surveyed group reduced their number of casual sex partners.

The survey also found a sharp drop in sexual behaviors carrying the highest risk for the spread of AIDS.

## AIDS EUTHANASIA

AMSTERDAM, NETHERLANDS (AP) - Dutch doctors have performed euthanasia on as many as 11 AIDS victims who chose death over prolonged suffering, a hospital spokesman said.

The city's Academic Medical Center, the only Dutch hospital with a ward for acquired immune deficiency syndrome sufferers, disclosed that one of its AIDS patients died in 1985 as a result of euthanasia.

The terminally ill patient chose to die rather than continue to suffer, hospital spokesman Roy Buize told the Associated Press. He refused to give further information on the case.

## CATHOLIC CLERGY WITH AIDS

CHICAGO, IL (GCN) - Two Roman Catholic priests and three religious brothers have died of AIDS in Chicago, according to the Chicago Times.

Brother Rick Garcia, Midwest coordinator of the Catholic Coalition for Gay Civil Rights and a long-time minister to Chicago's gay community, says that he knows of several other Catholic clergymen in the Chicago area who have the disease. Garcia faults the church for not facing the issues posed by the clergy with AIDS, stating that the "lack of response to the crisis is scandalous."

It is impossible to tell how many Catholic priests and religious nationwide have AIDS, since many conceal their condition.

Bill Kenkelen, a writer who has covered AIDS for the National Catholic Reporter, told the Chicago Tribune, "The presence of AIDS among men publicly committed to celibacy raises questions about what the church wants, or does not want, to know about itself."

## NOTES FROM NANCY

I was recently "laid up" for several weeks with a semi-broken hand, and during that period I had plenty of time to just lie around and think. One of my favorite daydreams was what I would do if I won "The Pick" drawing in the state lottery. That is a separate article in itself, but suffice it to say I have every cent planned for and spent.

A while ago I ordered a little book for \$15.00, called "State Lotteries: How To Get In And How To Win", authored by a woman who has won literally millions of dollars in lotteries all over the world. Although I won't reveal any "secrets" I gleaned from my readings, I will give away a few pointers as to what not to do when picking numbers for the weekly "Pick" drawings.

First of all, you may have noticed that most people pick their numbers based on special occasions, such as birthdays or anniversaries. Since most months have only 31 days, most people pick numbers under 31. You may have also noticed that most winning tickets include at least one, if not two, numbers over 31.

Secondly, in over 90% of all winning tickets, there are numbers that appear side by side, such as a 6-7 or a 29-30 combo. So, it is wise to include some combination

of two numbers in each ticket.

Lastly, but most important, keep in mind that 87% of all winning numbers have had a hit within the past ten drawings. And, 2/3 of all winning numbers have had a hit within the past five games, and over 1/2 of all winning numbers have hit within the past three games.

If you are interested in pursuing this, the local lottery office will provide you with a list of all the winning tickets since the inception of "The Pick". From this list, you can see patterns that have emerged based on mathematical possibilities, and the book I read tells you how to apply these patterns when picking your numbers.

And yes, it does work. Since applying these principles, I have won \$799 (from a 5 out of 6 win) and \$35.80 (from a 4 out of 6 win). And, for the past five weeks, I have picked all 6 winning numbers, but unfortunately they just haven't all been on the same ticket. I've come so close to winning I can taste it, and I just know any week now, I'll be hitting "the big one". When I do, I'll pass my book on to the highest bidder, but until then, it's "secrets" will remain with me. (Unless, of course, someone offers me the right price to copy it....)

a speech by Dan Bradley, former head of the Legal Services Corporation during the Carter administration. Bradley, the first openly-gay presidential appointee to publicly declare his homosexuality, is a person with AIDS.

Following Bradley's speech, the activists will continue their demonstration on the sidewalk in front of the White House.

Citing time, and life, consuming government red tape, inadequate drug trial procedures that leave thousands of PWA's isolated from promising therapies, a "laissez-faire" government approach to AIDS policy and response and other consequences of presidential inattention, the coalition is demanding five immediate government actions:

1. A "Manhattan Project on AIDS" empowered to cut through red tape and direct national policy on

AIDS, and embodying the same goal-oriented approach to research as the original Manhattan Project of the 1940's exhibited in the race to create the atomic bomb;

2. A national AIDS policy to prohibit discrimination against persons infected with the virus with respect to employment, housing, insurance and treatment;

3. Intensified drug testing, research and treatment efforts, with an emphasis on establishing a broader range of drug trials available to all people with AIDS;

4. A guarantee to confidentiality between doctor and patient; and

5. A full-scale national education program committed to reaching all individuals, particularly those in the highest risk groups, with information and materials graphic and effective enough to do the job.

I guess that's about it for this week. I hope everyone had a beautiful Memorial Day weekend and the following Summer be the same.

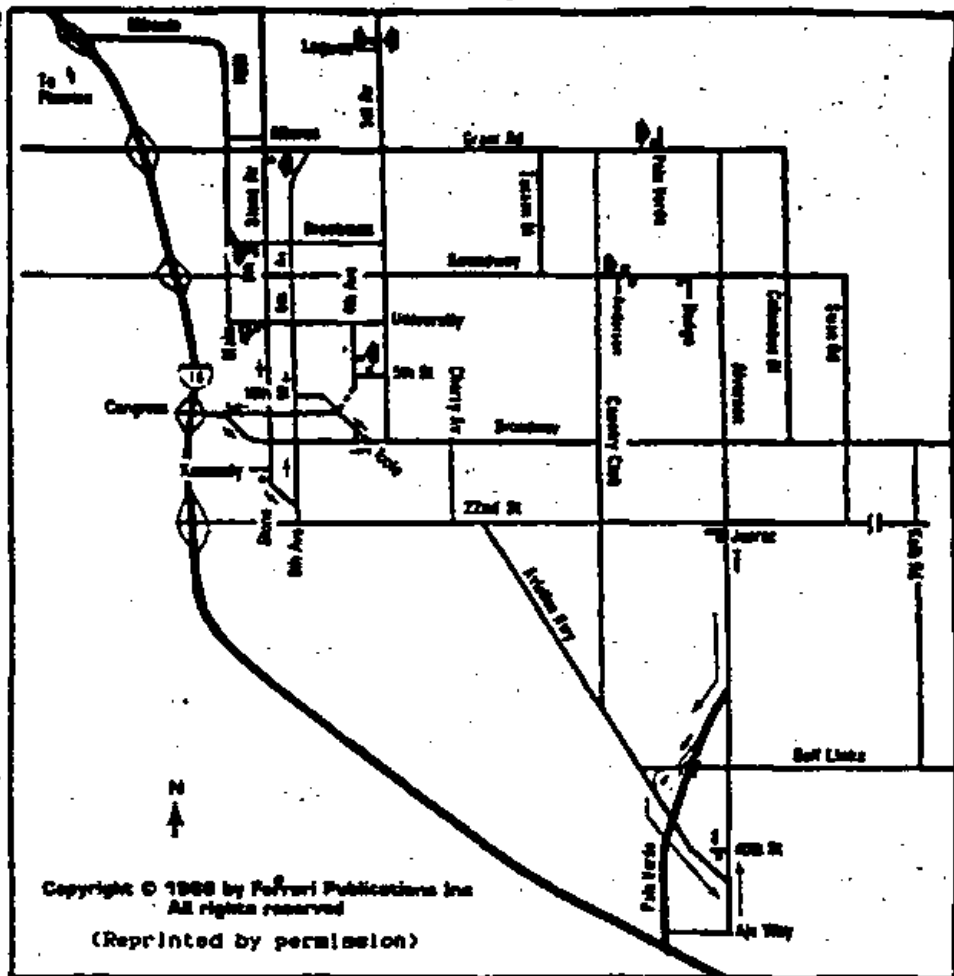
## News from MCC Tucson

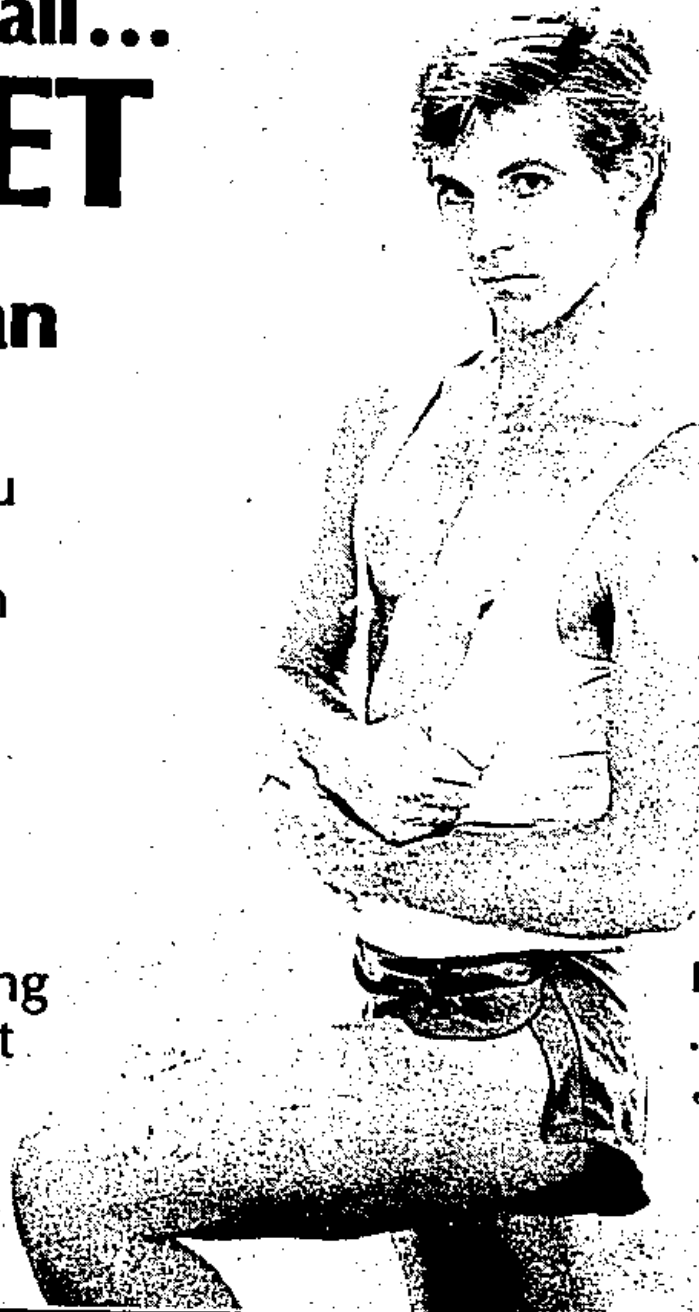

#### AIDS VACCINE HUNT MAY NOT BE SO HARD

Ho said his team identified four "soft spots" on various strains of HIV-1 virus by showing in a test tube experiment that they served as targets that allowed so-called neutralizing antibodies from rats and mice to deactivate the virus. The soft spots are portions of the protein that make up the virus coating or "envelope".

Three of the four soft spots are shared by all of the dozen or so widely different HIV-1 strains that have been analyzed so far, Ho said.

More research is needed to learn if human versions of those antibodies actually will attack the AIDS virus in people to prevent them from becoming infected, Ho and Hirsch cautioned.

Hirsch also said an effective AIDS vaccine might have to stimulate other parts of the immune system, not just provoke the body to create neutralizing antibodies.

Dr. Bernard Moss, chief of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases' viral disease laboratory in Bethesda, Md., said he hasn't seen Ho's study but it "sounds quite significant."

"It sounds like a real step," said Gerald Quinnan, director of virology at the U.S. Food and Drugs and Biologics in Rockville, Md. "I think it's significant."





## A View From Within

With the rapid departure of Gary Hart from the race for President, the field—both Democratic and Republican—is really wide open, and the eventual winner for the spot of 41st President of the United States is anyone's guess. ## ACLU recommends education

NEW YORK, NY - The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) announced the publication of a briefing paper on "AIDS and Civil Liberties" which contains medical and legal information about the disease and explains the organization's position on such controversial proposals as compulsory testing.

"The most effective response to AIDS, aside from supporting medical research, is education and prevention," said ACLU staff attorney Nan D. Hunter, a nationally recognized expert on AIDS and author of the briefing paper. "Trying to 'teach' abstinence is not the answer. Trying to pretend that only certain people can get infected is both wrong and dangerous. People need to know the facts about exactly what behaviors are dangerous and how they can protect themselves."

"Our flyer on AIDS and Civil Liberties contains basic information on policy implications of AIDS. It answers the questions most often asked of the ACLU."

The ACLU flyer, which is in question and answer form makes the following points:

1. "Medically, there is no evidence to suggest that the AIDS virus can be spread through normal workplace contact."

2. "Legally, firing an employee who has AIDS or the AIDS virus will, in most instances, violate state or federal law, which prohibits discrimination based on disability."

3. "Most federal or state court cases involving a person with AIDS or the AIDS virus have restored the person to work, and in most cases, school children with AIDS or the AIDS virus have been permitted to attend school."

4. "AIDS is not a 'Gay disease'; infection can occur between two men or between a man and a woman."

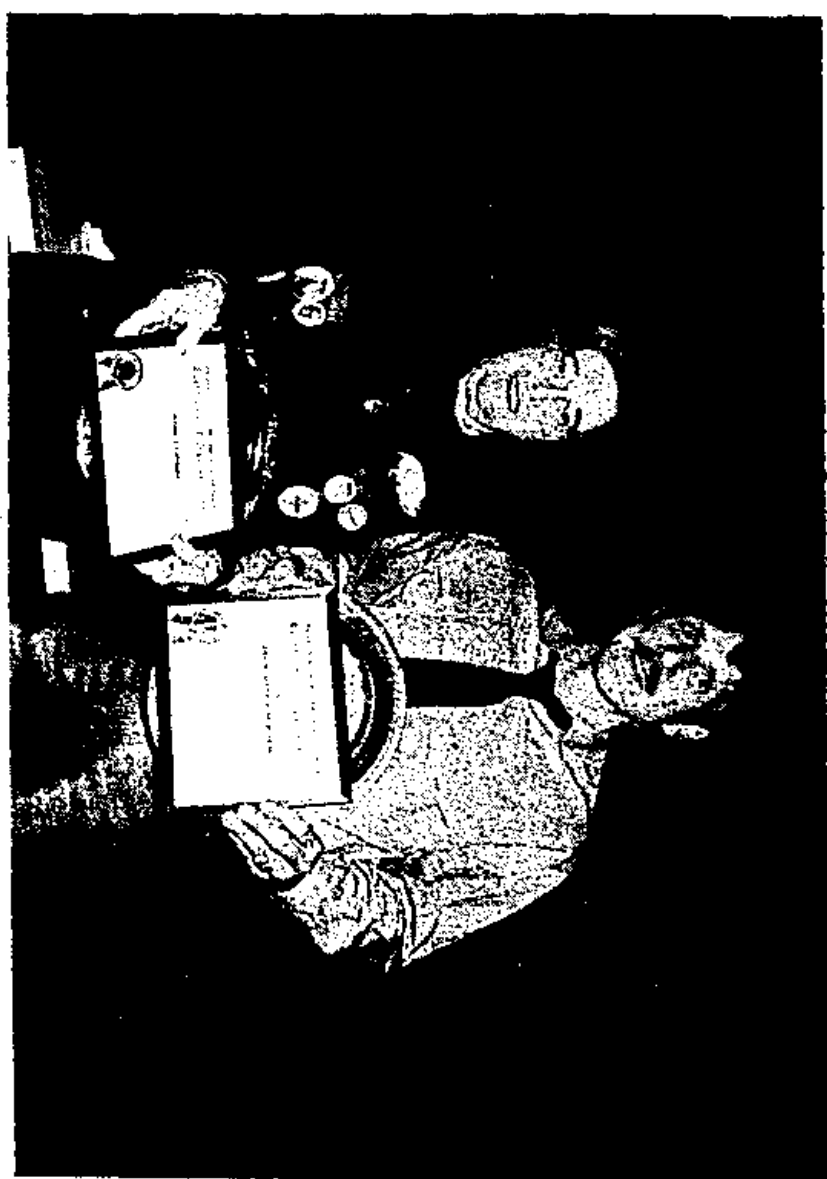
The ACLU supports access to voluntary testing for the AIDS virus, but opposes compulsory testing and the collection by the government of names and other information about people who test positive. Such measures are counter-productive, driving away people who need counseling but who fear discrimination and reprisal.

The ACLU recommends education about sexual and drug use practices that spread the disease; the easy availability of condoms for all sexually active persons, including teenagers; and the distribution, if necessary, of clean, disposable hypodermics to drug addicts. "And we need to pass strong anti-discrimination laws so that people will not have to fear that their efforts to seek counseling or treatment will lead to loss of their jobs or housing or insurance."

"AIDS and Civil Liberties is recommended for use by schools, employers, health departments and civic groups. A single copy is free. Multiple orders cost \$45 per thousand."
